

Dr. Garry Adams (Ph.D., Florida State University) is an Associate Professor in Strategic Management at Auburn University. Dr. Adams' research interests include corporate governance, power and politics in organizations, organizational learning and resource management, and merger and acquisition integration processes. His work has been published or is in press in outlets such as the Academy of Management Review, Journal of Applied Psychology, Journal of Management, Leadership Quarterly, Business Horizons, Journal of Knowledge

Management, Journal of Business and Psychology, Journal of Leadership and Organizational Studies, Journal of Managerial Issues and the initial volume of The Many Faces of Multi-Level Issues, among others

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Dr. Herman Aguinis (he/him) is the Avram Tucker Distinguished Scholar and Professor of Management at The George Washington University School of Business. He served as President of the Academy of Management, has been inducted into The Ph.D. Project Hall of Fame and, every year since 2018, Web of Science Highly Cited Researchers Reports has ranked him among the world's 100 most impactful researchers in Economics and Business. His research focuses on the global acquisition and deployment of talent in organizations and
